D. A plural noun names more than one person, place or thing.

Most nouns add *s* to form the plural:
hat - hats dog - dogs school - schools

Add *es* to nouns ending in *s, ss, x, z, ch* or *sh*:
box - boxes, match - matches crash - crashes

Change *y* to *i* to nouns ending in a *consonant + y*, then add *es*:
candy - candies puppy - puppies poppy - poppies

For nouns ending in *f* or *fe*, change the *f* to *v* then add *es*.
leaf - leaves knife - knives elf - elves

Some words ending in *o* preceded by a *consonant* add *es*, others just add *s*.
 Sometimes both forms are acceptable.
tomato - tomatoes piano - pianos

Some nouns use a different word for the plural:
man - men child - children

Others do not change at all:
deer - deer trout - trout sheep
